

Oklahoma 2014 ballot measures

Three ballot measures are certified for the November 4, 2014 ballot in the state of Oklahoma.

The 2014 legislative session began on February 3 and concluded on May 23, 2014. Three legislatively-referred constitutional amendments are slated to appear on the November ballot, addressing the administration of government, taxes and veterans. At least five other potential legislatively-referred constitutional amendments failed to make the ballot.

No initiatives will appear on the November 4, 2014 ballot. Initiative supporters were required to submit 155,216 valid signatures within 90 days of the potential measure's initial filing. No initiative campaigns successfully submitted enough signatures to refer measures to the ballot.

Historical facts

- Since 1990, an average of six measures have appeared on the even-numbered year ballots in Oklahoma. Therefore, 2014 is a below-average year based on the number of certified measures.
- From 1990 to 2013, the number of measures on statewide even-year ballots has ranged from two to 11.
- Since 1990, 61 of 76, or 80 percent, of Oklahoma ballot measures have been approved by voters.
- Conversely, 15 of 76, or 20 percent, of measures have been defeated.

LRCA Question 769	State Question 769	Admin of Gov't	Guarantees that public officials can also serve as officers and members of the National Guard, Oklahoma State Guard and Officers Reserve Corps
LRCA Question 770	State Question 770	Veterans	Permits a disabled veteran to sell their homestead and acquire another homestead property and keep their homestead tax exemption
LRCA Question 771	State Question 771	Veterans	Establishes a homestead exemption for the surviving spouse of military personnel who die in the line of duty

Type	Title	Subject	Description	Result
CICA	State Question 768	Marijuana	Legalizes the use, sale and cultivation of marijuana for medical purposes	
LRCA	Bonds for State Capitol Building Amendment	Bonds	Authorizes the state to issue \$120 million in bonds to pay for repairs to the Oklahoma State Capitol Building	
LRCA	Right to Bear Arms Amendment	Firearms	Clarifies what weapons citizens have a right to carry and who the state is allowed to regulate	
LRCA	Right to Farm and Ranch Amendment	Food & Agri	Provides for the right to engage in certain farming and ranching practices	
LRCA	Local Option for Manufacturing Property Tax Exemption Amendment	Taxes	Empowers county commissioner boards to decide whether a manufacturing facility would be exempt from property tax or not	
LRCA	School District Bonds for Safety Facilities Amendment	Bonds	Authorizes school districts to issue bonds to pay for personal safety facilities
